
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What is the Javits Center?

Waste diversion is a primary sustainability goal

 After rethinking, redesigning, and reducing waste, the Javits Center prioritizes reuse through the Javits Cares donation program.

 - Donation of food and non-food (furniture, household items) to nonprofit organizations throughout the New York City region
 - Quarterly employee engagement opportunities through the JavitsCares program during which employees volunteer their time at our donation partners' sites




Actions taken: catering





- Cultivated, our in-house catering and hospitality partner, follows the U.S. EPA Food Waste Hierarchy, with education and training support from the Sustainability Team.
- Chefs and catering team members follow proper health and safety standards to identify, collect, and rescue food for donation to local organizations.





Actions taken: catering

- Events may choose to include a food rescue wall to engage attendees in the donation process for individuallywrapped items.
- Pre-packaged meals and produce left in good condition are put in boxes and stored in our refrigerators.
- Stewarding teams schedule prompt pickups with a network of community partners distribute the food to New Yorkers in need.











Actions taken: event communications



• Sustainability Team has created an <u>Event Resources</u> webpage with resources for show organizers and event producers, including a section with resources on the Javits *Cares* program.

• Events Solutions and Exhibitor Solutions teams incorporate the Javits *Cares* program into their customer facing communications.

 Sustainability Team members are available for communicating directly with events and exhibitors.



Actions taken: event operations





- The Javits Center provides event organizers and exhibitors with neon stickers for tagging items as donations.
- Show cleaners spot additional items that are in good condition and place them in a safe location inside the building after the exhibitors and event organizers have left.
- The Sustainability Team matches donations with our wide network of groups throughout the city.








Actions taken: metrics





- The Sustainability Team provides sustainability metrics, including utility data and waste data, to event organizers upon request.
- Data is provided in a spreadsheet or in a formatted report card for an additional fee (see sample to the right).
- Javits Cares donations are included in these reports, contributing to the events' overall waste diversion efforts and positive environmental impact.





Partners



- The New York State Office of General Services facilitates donations of excess materials purchased by the Javits Center for internal use by distributing to other state agencies.
- We have established strong relationships with a growing list of local donation partners that accept our excess food (City Harvest, ReThink Food, House of Good Deeds, etc) and receive excess materials (Materials for the Arts, House of Good Deeds, Big Reuse, The Bowery Mission, NYCHA Community Centers, etc).
- At the end of 2022, we began working with New York based upcycling hauler Raeri to assist with donation matching, pickups, and expanding our reach.



Results achieved



- In 2022, the JavitsCares program facilitated the donation of more than 78.9 metric tonnes total. This consisted of:
 - 48.8 metric tonnes of food, and
 - 38.1 metric tonnes of non-food items such as furniture, household items, and construction materials.
- The JavitsCares program also offered Javits Center employees quarterly volunteer engagement opportunities at non-profit organizations throughout New York City.







- In 2022, we donated over 13 full trailers of furniture, household items, and school/art supplies via <u>Materials for the Arts</u>, NYC's largest creative reuse center, where it was distributed to NYC schools and arts nonprofits.
- Below, Javits Center employees volunteer at Materials for the Arts, by assisting with organizing their warehouse for schools and nonprofits to "shop for free."











 At the end of 2022's Summer Fancy Food Show, City Harvest staff and volunteers rescued over 100,000 lbs of food for New Yorkers in need – a record for the City Harvest, the Specialty Food Association, and the

 We donated approximately 1 tonne of plants from the 2022 Auto Show via <u>Raeri</u> to <u>Synergi Urban Garden 2.0</u>, a community center in the Bronx that provides a safe space for families to collaboratively grow food and learn agriculture.

 The Javits Center and Cultivated donated several tonnes of food to <u>ReThink Food</u> in 2022. Rethink Food is a non-profit organization fighting food waste and hunger by upcycling produce and catering left behind into healthy whole meals for communities in need.









- Creative reuse art installation for the Nest Climate Summit in 2022:
 - Javits Center presented a work of art by Bronx-based artist Dario Mohr.
 - Inspired by the Javits Center's Javits Cares program and partnership with Materials For the Arts (MFTA).
 - Using materials donated after recent events, as well as solar panels from the venue's green roof, Dario created a piece that underscores the need to repurpose, reuse and reimagine the world around us.
